The Greek peninsula became a Roman protectorate in 146 BC, and the Aegean islands were added to this territory in 133 BC. Athens and other Greek cities revolted in 88 BC, and the peninsula was crushed by the Roman general Sulla. The Byzantine Empire was a Greek-speaking, Orthodox Christian state that existed from about 500 to 1453. Its capital was Constantinople, now Istanbul. Having taken the capital city, the crusaders from the west went on to conquer most of the empire, although Constantinople was eventually won back fifty-seven years later, and what we now generally call the 'Byzantine' empire did manage to survive into the fifteenth century before its final irrevocable conquest by the Ottoman Turks.
